Child Abuse

Child abuse is the treatment of a child under the age of 18, often in the context of a relationship of responsibility, trust, or power that endangers or impairs the health or welfare of a child.



Types of Abuse?

- Physical non-accidental injury
- Emotional commission and omission
- Sexual verbal, visual, physical
- Neglect failure to provide for basic needs




Prevalence Probabilities


- <u>1 in 6 boys</u> and <u>1 in 4 girls</u> are sexually abused before the age of 18.
- <u>300,000</u> children are abused <u>every year.</u>
- Those with a prior history of victimization have an increased risk of re-victimization by over <u>1000</u>%.
- <u>60%</u> of offenders are <u>known</u> to the child (family friends, babysitters, childcare providers.
- <u>30%</u> of offenders are <u>family</u> members (parents, brothers, uncles, cousins).



Types of Abuse in 2013 International Schools



You should know about Child Sexual Offenders



1. Offenders have many victims.



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2. Offenders can be the **most unsuspecting** people.



3. Offenders are **not strangers**.



4. Offenders often **prey upon trusting and vulnerable** young people.



5. Offenders are often attracted to the Christian community.



Signs of Possible Offenders

- Do <u>verbal or nonverbal cues</u> cause you concern about the child's well being when with a particular adult or minor?
- Does the minor have contact with someone you know but <u>whose behavior you don't</u> trust?
- Does the minor repeatedly spend <u>unaccounted-for and alone time</u> with someone?

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Signs of Possible Offenders

- Does the person <u>consistently get involved</u> in <u>activities</u> where there are <u>children</u>?
- Again, does the person seem to focus on children who are vulnerable, i.e. come from broken homes, parents are absent from their lives, don't relate well to other children, etc.?



Indicators of Abuse

- <u>Changes</u> in the child's mood, behavior or performance.
- Inexplicable fears or worries, nightmares or other sleep disturbance.
- <u>Unaccountable</u> changes in the child's appetite.
 <u>Increase</u> in physical complaints with <u>no</u> <u>apparent basis</u>, particularly headaches and stomachaches.

Indicators of Abuse

- <u>Unexplained</u> fear or aversion to a specific person, place or activity.
- <u>Changes</u> in the child's relations.
- <u>Lost</u> interest in activities that previously brought pleasure.
- <u>Sudden</u> need to keep <u>secrets</u> or have a "secret" friend.
- <u>Unnatural increase</u> in sexual interest, knowledge or behavior including sexualized play.

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Effects of Abuse

- Emotional
 - Guilt, self-condemnation, hopelessness
 - Doesn't express emotions
 - Intense emotions



Effects of Abuse

- <u>Relational</u>
 - Patterns that hide inward guilt, self-disdain, or anger
 - Disconnected from giving or receiving emotions



Effects of Abuse

- Spiritual
 - Learn unseen through seen
 - Misunderstands good and evil
 - Skewed view of God
 - Lack of connection with God

Scenario #1
